## LIVE THE STORY

- ➤ In light of Isaiah's simple call to obedience, away from our "drunkenness" to be filled with the Spirit (32:15), read and discuss Ephesians 5:18 and the preceding verses (3-17).
- ➤ What are some ways that you are tempted to complicate the simple truth of Christ and how He calls you to live?
- > Are there things you pursuing that draw you away from Christ?
- Have there been times when have you heard Christ directing you to stop doing something, or to do something, but you disobeyed? Explain what repentance looks like in this.
- ➤ How are we called in our text to "walk in the Spirit" and what kind of fruit are we called to bear? Discuss Galatians 5:16-24 in light of this text in Isaiah.
