LIVE THE STORY

We must not only love the Gospel Story, we must begin to live the Gospel Story, indeed, to have the Central Character live in us.

- Can you think of reasons why the *invisibility of God* is not a reasonable objection to His existence?
- > Why must the rejection of God as Creator be an active suppression of the truth?
- ➤ How do these two chapters speak of the exclusivity of God? How does this contrast to the ideas of pluralism?
- How does 45:23-34 speak of the exclusive nature of YHWH as God? How does Philippians 2:9-11 therefore speak of the Deity of Christ?
- What qualifies God to make the exclusive claims of Godhood that He does?
- What makes YHWH clearly set apart from the idols of the nations?
- Isaiah speaks of an idolatry that assigns person-hood and power to created inanimate things. Is this form of idolatry relevant in our day? How might we see it?
- ➤ In addition to creation, how does God offer His proof-of-life in Isaiah 44-45? And how in the later chapters of Isaiah (like Isaiah 53, for example) does He offer similar proof?

A. In Isaiah 44-45 God is mocking the worship of idols and offering proof-of-life for Himself.

- B. Creation is spouting proof-of-life for God, but idol worshipers reject it!
 - i. Psalm 19:1-4
 - ii. Romans 1:18-23

- a) Suppression of the truth is motivated by wickedness.
- b) The *invisibility of God* is really not a reasonable objection to His existence.
- C. Who then is like me? Is there a god besides me?

The Exclusive Claims of YHWH (44:6-8)

- A. God's Claims are Clear:
 - i. 44:6, 8,
 - ii. 45:5-6, 18, 21-22
 - iii. What qualifies God to make these claims? 44:24
- B. God lays out His challenge from the outset (44:7).

II. The Delusion of Idol-Worship (44:9-20)

- A. The self-evident absurdity of idol-making
 - i. What is idolatry?
 - a) Treasuring and trusting in created things and attributing person-hood and power to them.
 - b) Assigning life and power to material or inanimate things.
 - ii. Isaiah speaks in caricature to show the utter absurdity of the process.
