LIVE THE STORY

 - > Chapter 60 is possible because of 59:21.
 - What does the Spirit empowered/filled community look like?

l. Light Has Come (60:1-4, 19-20)

- A. When the Spirit comes it is the beginning of a new day.
- B. Light represents salvation (19-20)
 - i. Isaiah 5:30; 8:22; 9:2
 - ii. John 1:4

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i. Genesis 1:16; 8:22

Those who mourn their sin are living in a new day, no longer under the same rules (sin and death). No longer does a blackened sun, or a blood red moon (signs of catastrophe) mean darkness for these people. All is light in the Lord!

- ii. This is about complete reversal!
- iii. The complete opposite of captivity; the complete opposite of what it is like to be under the wrath of God!

II. Nations Have Come (60:3-9)

- A. Nations will come to your light, kings to the brightness of your dawn.
- B. Isaiah has come full circle
 - i. Isaiah 2:3-6
 - ii. Isaiah 6 w/ 59:21.

III. Rebuilding Has Begun

- A. The nations are bringing people, bringing wealth and building materials, and bringing sacrifices.
 - i. Sons and daughters are being carried on their arms. (4)

- ii. Day or night the gates never shut (11).
- B. The nations are rebuilding and serving. (10)
- C. God is adorning His Temple with beauty! (7, 9, 13, 21)
