The disciples thought Jesus' death was the end of all their hopes and dreams. Jesus' death wasn't the end and His resurrection is just the beginning.

Questions for discussion and application

- Read Luke 24 out loud. What stands out to you?
- The two disciples on the road said, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us..." What did Jesus teach the two disciples on the road to Emmaus that made their hearts burn within them? Look at Luke 24:27.
- We can assume that people in the 1st century were easily convinced of spiritual realities, unlike our more cynical age. Jesus repeatedly told his disciples: *"I will die, but I will rise on the third day."* It is now the third day. What is the reaction of the eleven when Jesus appears before them in Luke 24:37-38?
- What evidence does Jesus give the disciples that it's truly him? What is significant about showing them his hands and feet?
- Imagine you were in that room with the disciples. What thoughts and emotions might be going through your mind? What does it mean that *"they did not believe it because of joy and amazement"*?
- Maybe you're seeing this for the first time that Jesus Christ is the thread that holds the entire story of redemption together. Why is this so important? How is this impacting your understanding of the Scriptures?
- Jesus said in Luke 24:44 "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled (come to completion) that is written about me...." What does this mean for us here and now? Read verses 46-47 too.
- What will happen if we leave the stories in the Bible as unconnected stories; unrelated to each other and to the big picture of a coming Savior?
- Who can you share this story with?
