 - 2. Identification of God's elect
 - 3. Communicated through visions or an angel, sometimes both
 - 4. Describes the end of this age and the coming of a new better age
 - 5. Includes a cataclysmic and final judgment against the wicked
- C. Well known to biblical authors and quoted in the NT
