  - i. Is this some kind of outline of the book?

ii. V19 is like the language in Daniel 10, with a modification.

John's Revelation was not about some distant future set of events. It was about what began to unfold with the Ascension of Christ and the mission of the church.

**Introduction:** Grace always makes a claim on our lives.

### John's Prophetic Calling (1:9-11)

- A. Brother and a sharer in three things which we inherit in Jesus.
  - i. The suffering (the affliction, the tribulation).
  - ii. The kingdom (the reign of Christ)
  - iii. The endurance (bearing up under)

This suffering (affliction, tribulation) is not some future event but John's and the church's present experience.

- B. John, the Expert Witness
  - i. John is qualified as a faithful witness.
  - ii. John is on the Island of Patmos.

- C. On the Lord's Day...
  - i. This isn't merely about what day of the week it was.
  - ii. The Lord's Day was established by the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.
- D. John, the Prophetic Seer
  - i. John was in the spirit and heard a loud voice like a trumpet.
    - a) Ezek. 3:12
    - b) Exo. 19:16, 19
  - ii. This is the voice of YHWH.

## I. Jesus' Priestly Ministry (12-1:16)

- A. A Pattern: Heard > Saw
  - i. This pattern will be repeated in Revelation.
  - ii. He hears the voice of God, and He turns to see a human.
- B. A Priest
  - i. One walking among the lampstands of the temple wearing this clothing was called a priest.
    - a) Zechariah 4
    - b) The one lampstand is now seven lampstands.

- ii. "like a son of man" (Dan. 7:13)
- C. His Priestly Garments
  - i. The robe and sash are priestly garments
  - ii. The hair on his head being white like wool (Dan. 7:9)
  - iii. Eyes like a flaming fire (ref. Rev. 19:11-12)
  - iv. Feet like bronze glowing in a furnace
  - v. The sharp 2-edged sword coming from his mouth
  - vi. His face shining like the sun full force (Judg. 5:31)

Christ's priestly ministry aims to purify our worship and our witness.
